Mezzo-soprano Shachar Lavi, currently a member of the Nationaltheater Mannheim opera ensemble (Germany), graduated her bachelor degree *with honors* in Performing Arts from the Buchmann-Mehta School of Music (Tel Aviv University). Lavi was a member of the "Meitar" Opera Studio of the Israeli Opera and a member of the Heidelberg Opera ensemble during seasons 2017/18–2018/19.

Her recent achievements include a debut performance at Weill Recital Hall, Carnegie Hall (NYC), and a returning guest appearance at the Rossini Festival (Pesaro, Italy), where she performed in a gala concert that received critical acclaim. Recently, Shachar joined the Jewish Chamber Orchestra München and recorded a number of Yiddish song cycles, which will be released in November 2025. Furthermore, her recording of the Italian cantata *La Lucrezia* (by G. F. Händel) received special recognition from Deutschlandfunk Kultur and was featured in one of their programs.

Shachar was nominated for Best Young Artist of the 2017–18 season in the prestigious *Opernwelt Jahrbuch 2018* (*Nachwuchskünstlerin des Jahres*) and is a recipient of scholarships from the America-Israel Cultural Foundation, the Ronen Foundation for Outstanding Israeli Artists, the IVAI Opera Workshop – Fay Harbour Scholarship, as well as multiple excellence scholarships and awards from the Buchmann-Mehta vocal competitions. She also won 3rd prize at the "Flaviano Labò" Opera Competition in Piacenza, Italy.
